How are the costs covered?

The contraceptives cost less than 100 euros: The application can also be made retrospectively – if the costs have already been paid by the applicant – but at the latest within one month after the prescription has been issued.

The contraceptives cost more than 100 euros:

The application must be made before the treatment. To do this, you need a cost estimate from the doctor or pharmacy, which you then submit. The declaration of cost cover (in German: "Kostenübernahmeerklärung") is sent directly to the doctor's surgery or pharmacy. They will then settle the bill directly with the city administration.

Assumption of costs for contraceptives



A self-determined life also includes taking responsibility for family planning. We want you to be able to decide when you want to have a child and how you plan your family.

Contraceptives are expensive. It is important that the decision about which contraceptive to use does not depend on your income. The city of Ingolstadt has, therefore, set up a Family Planning Fund (Familienplanungsfonds).

You have no money for contraceptives?

If you live in the City of Ingolstadt and receive certain social benefits, the costs for your contraceptives can be covered by the city. The benefits are voluntary, there is no legal entitlement.

What requirements do I have to fulfil?

You must live in Ingolstadt and have the Ingol-stadtPass or receive one of the following social benefits, for example: Social benefit (Sozialgeld), social assistance (Sozialhilfe), unemployment benefit 2 (Arbeitslosengeld 2), housing benefit (Wohngeld), child supplement (Kinderzuschlag), student loan (Bafög), vocational training allowance (Berufsausbildungsbeihilfe) or are currently doing a voluntary social / ecological year (freiwilliges soziales Jahr / ökologisches Jahr) or national service (Bundesfreiwilligendienst). Which contraceptives are paid for?

The Pass mainly covers the costs of medically prescribed contraceptives or contraceptive measures. The following costs, in particular, are, therefore, eligible for reimbursement

- The pill
- Three-month injection
- Hormone/copper coil
- Copper chain
- Contraceptive sticks
- Vaginal ring
- Contraceptive patch
- Morning-after pill
- Vasectomy
- Sterilisation




For additional protection against sexually transmitted diseases, **condoms** are also financed. Both women and men can apply for these.

Other contraceptives that are not subject to prescription can only be covered if this contraceptive method has been approved in writing by a pregnancy advice centre (Schwangerschaftsberatungsstelle) or a doctor in each individual case.
